

Waste Management Statement

REDUCE, REUSE AND RECYCLE WHEREVER POSSIBLE

A great deal of construction waste can be reused or recycled. Reuse and the recycling of waste can help to protect the environment and reduce the need for raw materials. It can also help to save the Company money.

Dawnus Construction will endeavor to:

REDUCE the amount of waste you create by:

- ❖ Storing materials correctly in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
- ❖ Storing materials in the designated storage areas to prevent damage.
- ❖ Taking only what you need for the job.
- ❖ Avoiding the over ordering of materials.

REUSE materials on site:

- ❖ Shuttering can be used a number of times.
- ❖ Timber off-cuts can be reused as stakes for setting out.
- ❖ Excavated spoil can sometimes be reused on site as suitable engineering fill or landscaping material.
- ❖ Empty pallets and drums can be returned to the supplier for reuse.

RECYCLE there are lots of materials that can be recycled on the site, use the skips and bins where provided to recycle the following:


- ❖ Scrap metal.
- ❖ Timber.
- ❖ Plasterboard
- ❖ Plastic pipes and other plastics.
- ❖ Paper and cardboard.
- ❖ Trees and other vegetation for wood chip, mulch or compost.
- ❖ Demolition waste –concrete, bricks and blacktop.
- ❖ Site supervisors will arrange for the safe storage and correct disposal of all site wastes.

Site guidelines:

- ❖ Keeping the site clean and tidy.
- ❖ Do not burn waste on site.
- ❖ Store waste materials safely and securely in the bins and skips provided.
- ❖ Keep covers on skips to prevent wind blown litter.
- ❖ Segregate wastes into the appropriate bins or skips where provided.

Hazardous Waste

Some waste materials may contain substances that are hazardous to your health or the environment and will require special arrangements for disposal. These wastes must be stored separately from other general waste in the special receptacles provided, and then disposed of in accordance with the product Material Safety Data Sheets.
